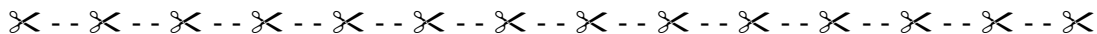

Come enjoy the great outdoors of Florida with Bill and Merilee Clifton - creationists, authors, Florida Master Naturalists, and science educators. The Cliftons will guide our group from Canaveral National Seashore (CNS) to Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge (MINWR), Indian River Lagoon (IRL), and the St. Johns River, explaining Florida's water systems from the perspective of God's great design in creation.

We will meet between 7:30 and 7:45 AM at Bridgewater Marketplace Shopping Center on East Colonial Dr., in the parking lot between Subway and Winn Dixie and depart for CNS by 8:00 AM. This shopping center is located just east of the intersection of Hwy. 408 (East-West Expressway, Exit 23 – Titusville) and Hwy. 50 / Colonial Dr. For directions from www.mapquest.com, use Subway's address, 13212 E. Colonial Dr., Orlando 32826. At CNS, we will begin with an orientation and beach activities at this saltwater ecosystem. Then we're off to MINWR, where we will look at their educational displays and see a film on the ecology of the area. **Be sure to bring a picnic lunch.** We will eat lunch at IRL, where we will also get into the brackish water with seining nets. Our "Capture and Release Permit" allows us to study the marine specimens we catch in our nets and then return them to the water. We never know what we might find, but have caught fish, shrimp, crabs, seahorses, jellyfish, puffer fish, horseshoe crabs, stingrays, and more! Sometimes we see dolphins and manatees. **TIE-ON SHOES ARE REQUIRED to get into the water! Bring a towel, change of clothes, dry shoes, plastic bag for wet things, and container of water to rinse feet after seining.** Our last stop is the St. Johns River where we'll observe the plant and animal life of this freshwater habitat from an airboat. Watch for alligators, bald eagles, many other birds, turtles, and more! There's an awesome gift / snack shop at the airboat place. Our day as a group will end after the airboat ride at approximately 3:30 PM in Christmas, FL. It's always a good idea to bring sunscreen, insect repellent, water, rain poncho, and camera.
