

Earth & Physical Sciences for Grades 3-4	2:30-4:00 PM



February Reminders for Science Partners Classes

The Human Heart – By Design



The human heart is the focus of Valentine's Day. Here are some interesting facts about our heart and circulatory system that were designed by our Creator to provide us with "abundant life." (Selections from *Body By Design*, by Alan L. Gillen.)

- ♥ The human body has over 60,000 miles of blood vessels – that's 2½ times the distance around the Earth's equator.
- ♥ The heart beats an average of 70 times per minute. That's 4,200 beats per hour or 100,800 beats per day – nonstop – for the rest of your life!
- ♥ The heart pumps about 2,000 gallons of blood each day for a total of over 700,000 gallons each year! To accomplish this, chambers of the heart must contract and relax on a highly coordinated series of actions.
- ♥ The circulatory system even has a method of clotting in case a rupture occurs that might cause blood loss. Imagine a punctured bicycle tire repairing and re-inflating itself without your even knowing it!
- ♥ Red blood cells bathe every other cell in the body with fresh oxygen from the lungs and carry away harmful carbon dioxide gas to be expelled by the lungs.

Isn't God awesome to create such a wonderful thing as the human heart! Have you given Him yours?

Our goal is to provide participants with a unique and fascinating creationist perspective of God's great design in nature and to teach them how to see God's handiwork in all of creation! March 16 (Friday): Florida's Water Systems. Come along with the Cliftons as we explore Florida's Water Systems from the perspective of God's great design in creation. This day's adventures will include:



Canaveral National Seashore - beach talk, beach walk, and cleanup at this saltwater ecosystem, learning about the ocean and the plants and animals that live in and around it. We will look for sea beans, turtle nests, shore birds, animal tracks, and more as we hike and play CNS Bingo.

Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge – see educational displays and film on the ecology of MINWR and NASA.

Indian River Lagoon – wade into this brackish water habitat with seining nets, dip nets, and buckets. With our "Catch and Release" permit, on past field trips we have caught various marine specimens such as fish, shrimp, crabs, seahorses, jellyfish, puffer fish, horseshoe crabs, stingrays, etc. We often see manatees and dolphins.



St. Johns River – board an airboat to observe the plant and animal life of this freshwater environment. We often see gators, eagles, a variety of water birds, turtles, etc. You'll also have the opportunity to hold a baby gator!

April 16 (Monday): The Heavens Declare! workshop. Join us at WaterStone Church in Longwood as we **focus on astronomy** in an "out of this world" workshop!
