Join Bill and Merilee Clifton - creationists, authors, Florida Master Naturalists, and science educators - as we **focus on “Florida’s Gentle Giant” - the West Indian Manatee**. Our destination is Citrus County, *The Nature Coast*. In the morning, outfitted with **wetsuits, masks, snorkels, and fins**, we will **take a pontoon boat ride in search of manatees**. When we find them, we’ll join them in the crystal clear, spring-fed waters – the only place in Florida where it is legal to swim with manatees! During our **manatee encounter**, we’ll observe these sociable, threatened mammals “up close and personal.” We’ll study them in their natural habitat and discover what they look like, how they breathe, what they eat, and more! We’ll also learn what threatens their survival and how we can help.

Then, we’ll have our picnic lunch and tour **Homosassa Springs Wildlife Park**. This 166-acre park, located at the headwater of the Homosassa River, is a **showcase for native Florida wildlife**. We’ll visit the **Discovery Center** and also see many examples of Florida wildlife, some endangered or threatened. We’ll take the **“Wildlife Walk”** through natural wildlife habitats, keeping an eye out for alligators, snakes, deer, Florida black bear, bobcats, otter, Florida panthers, manatees (underwater viewing), and a variety of birds including endangered whooping cranes.

We will meet at American Pro Diving Center, 821 SE US Hwy. 19, Crystal River 34429, between 7:45 and 8:00 AM. IF YOU ARE LATE, YOU WILL LITERALLY MISS THE BOAT! Our day as a group will end at Homosassa Springs Wildlife Park around 3:00 PM. **Be sure to bring a picnic lunch.** It’s always a good idea to bring sunscreen, insect repellent, water, rain poncho, and camera. If you have any questions, please email Merilee Clifton at sciencepartners@cfl.rr.com or call / text 407-808-4458. **Cost includes pontoon boat ride, wetsuit / mask / snorkel / fins rental, gratuities for pontoon boat crew, and entrance to Homosassa Springs Wildlife Park.**

Minimum number is 20. Maximum number is 41 (capacity for two boats). A supervising adult must accompany and swim with all children. Students may not be left unattended on the boat. **Minimum age is five years.** Cost (to snorkel or just ride the boat) for 5 - 12 years old is \$75 and for 13 years and up is \$80. Make check payable to **Science Partners** and return with registration form below to **343 Allison Ave., Longwood, FL 32750. Deadline for minimum number is Friday, February 3, 2023. Late registrations may be accepted, space permitting and with dive shop’s approval.**

Please read entirely and contact us if you have any questions!

WHO: Manatee Snorkel Encounter participants.

WHERE: Meet at **American Pro Diving Center, 821 SE US 19, Crystal River between 7:45 and 8:00 AM.** It is critical that you be on time! **If you are late, you will literally miss the boat!** Manatees are early risers! Please check driving directions and driving time – and be sure to allow extra time from your home. Don't forget change or E-pass if you use toll roads.

WHAT TO WEAR: Please **WEAR YOUR BATHING SUIT** under your clothes to the dive shop. This will save us a lot of time as we "gear up" (put on wetsuits and get masks, snorkels, and fins).

WHAT TO BRING: ***Please read checklist below carefully. Everything has a specific purpose.***

Each Family / Car:	Each Person – <i>Bring the following items in a bag:</i>
Directions.	Picnic lunch in disposable bag (or one you can carry). No coolers.
Full Tank of Gas.	After snorkeling and taking wetsuit off on the boat, a sweat suit (or something with long sleeves and long pants) to wear over your wet bathing suit. Shoes that can get wet on boat. Ride back may be chilly!
E-pass/Change.	
Sunscreen.	Dry clothes and shoes to change into after boat returns to land (can be what you wear over bathing suit to dive shop), towel, undergarments.
Insect Repellent.	
Water.	Small plastic bag(s) for wet clothes, bathing suit, and towel.
Snacks.	Pencil to work on student activity booklet during the day.
	Optional: Hat, rain poncho, and camera. You might also consider a disposable underwater camera.

SCHEDULE:

Be at the dive shop in Crystal River between 7:45 and 8:00 AM. (We have hotel information if you'd like to go over the day before.) Dive shop personnel will meet us and direct us as we gear up. We are required to view a short video, *Manatee Manners*, on appropriate behavior in the water with the manatees. Then we'll drive to Pete's Pier and leave our cars (parking \$5 – subject to change). Driving directions will be provided. The pontoon boat(s) will pick us up there, and we'll head out in search of manatees. We'll snorkel with the manatees and then return to the pier around 11:00 AM. We'll drive back to the dive shop to change clothes. Then, we'll eat our picnic lunches and Mr. Clifton will give us a lesson on manatees. Around 1:00 PM, we'll enter Homosassa Springs Wildlife Park where we'll take their "Wildlife Walk," enter a floating underwater manatee observatory, and observe many native Florida animals, birds, and plants in their natural settings. Our day as a group will end at HSWP around 3:00 PM. You are welcome to stay in the park until it closes at 5:30 PM.
